



**Julius W. Few, MD** is a plastic surgeon recognized in the U.S. and internationally for his dedication, research and patient advocacy in aesthetic plastic surgery and cosmetic medicine. His innovation and research in aesthetic plastic surgery, natural-looking improvements, minimally invasive surgery and patient safety have all been highlighted in consumer media ranging from Good Morning America, 20/20, Today and CNN to prestigious medical journals including *Aesthetic Plastic Surgery*, *Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery* and *Surgery*. Included in Crain's "Forty Under 40" and named for three consecutive years by Chicago Magazine as a "Top Doc," Dr. Few has a warm and refined charm to complement his technical skill as a surgeon and his meticulous detail whether in facial aesthetics or in his passion for visual arts.

**Certified by the American Board of Plastic Surgery**, Dr. Few is a clinical associate at the prestigious University of Chicago, and served for more than 8 years as assistant and associate professor of the Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine where he developed and founded the Aesthetic Plastic Surgery and Breast Surgery Fellowship programs. He is a noted leader within the plastic surgery specialty, serving on the board of directors, as a committee chairman, committee member and editor for the American Society for Aesthetic Plastic Surgery, and as a committee member for the American Society of Plastic Surgeons. Dr. Few is a founding member of the internationally recognized Physicians Coalition for Injectable Safety, serves the Board of Governors of the Chicago Society of Plastic Surgeons and serves as the first president of the Illinois Society of Plastic Surgeons. Dr. Few has studied at the University of Michigan and the University of Chicago Pritzker School of Medicine, Harvard University, St. Mary's Medical College in London and at Michigan State University.

**Dr. Few practices and resides in Chicago, Illinois and is a native of Michigan.** He and his family enjoy the cultural and civic events in Chicago where Dr. Few serves on the Board of Directors for the famed Grant Park as well as retreats to the Lake Michigan shore. He dedicates his time to efforts that enrich the lives of children, including Youth Guidance, Chicago, and to causes that support quality of life for women, including serving on the Avon Foundation Scientific Advisory Board since 2004.
